



Policy on Personal Data Processing

(GDPR EU 2016/679, art. 13)¹

The processing of personal data requested preliminarily to the participation in events organized by the Permanent Mission of Italy to the United Nations and in meetings with executives and officials of the Permanent Mission of Italy to the United Nations is based on the principles of lawfulness, correctness and transparency in order to protect the fundamental rights and freedoms of natural persons.

To this end, pursuant to art. 13 (and, if applicable, 14) of the GDPR, the following information is provided:

1. The Data Controller

2. The Data Protection Officer

3. Personal data processed

Data is processed if needed to identify and to allow correct management of correspondence with them, as well as to allow access to the UN Headquarters at events therein organized by the Mission.

4. Purpose of the processing

The processing of personal data is aimed to identify individuals and to allow correct management of correspondence with them, as well as to allow physical access of the latter to the premises of the Permanent Mission of Italy to the United Nations and to the United Nations Headquarters in order

to take part in meetings and events organized by the Mission and in meetings with its executives and officials.

5. Legal base of data processing

Data processing will be carried out pursuant to letter e) of art. 6 of the GDPR: "the processing is necessary for the execution of a task of public interest or connected to the exercise of public powers vested in the data controller". Failure to provide data implies the impossibility for interested parties to access to the premises of the Permanent Mission of Italy to the United Nations and the UN Headquarters and therefore to participate in events, meetings and gatherings at the latter.

6. Treatment methods

Data processing, carried out by specifically appointed personnel, will be carried out in a mixed modality, both manual and automated.

7. Transmission of data to third parties

Personal data is transferred to the United Nations Organization exclusively to allow interested parties to access the United Nations Headquarters, and with exclusive reference to the completion of the relevant security procedures that regulate access to the building. The United Nations offers adequate guarantees for the protection of personal data.

8. Data retention period

Personal data of the interested parties will be retained for the duration of the events, meetings and gatherings at the Permanent Mission and the United Nations Headquarters in which they participate, and, for lists of participants attached to the Mission's budget documents, for a minimum of five years as mandated by the law.

9. Rights of the interested party

The interested party has the right to access their personal data and, under the conditions established by current legislation, to have it rectified. Within the limits of the law, they can also request data be deleted, the limitation of the processing or the opposition to the processing. In these cases, the interested party must submit a specific request to the structure indicated in point 1, informing the MAECI RPD for information.

10. Complaints

Individuals who believe their privacy rights have been violated can file a complaint with the DPO of Italy's Ministry of Foreign Affairs.
